



Connecting an Android mobile device to eduroam wi-fi

The easiest way to connect your Android mobile device to the eduroam wireless network is by downloading the eduroam CAT file. This will make all the necessary set-up changes for you. Simply

- 1 Go to <https://cat.eduroam.org>
- 2 Click the large **download your eduroam installer** button
- 3 Select University of Brighton as your home institution
- 4 Click to download and follow instructions on screen
- 5 remember that your eduroam username is your normal university username followed by @brighton.ac.uk, eg

abc1@brighton.ac.uk

Your eduroam password your normal university password

- 6 Select eduroam from the list of available wireless services ... and you're ready to go

Manual set-up

If you can't download the CAT file, you can try making the set-up changes yourself:

- 1 Go to **Settings**
- 2 Under "**Wireless and Network**", choose **Wi-Fi**
- 3 You should see "**eduroam**" listed. If you've already tried to connect to it, please press and hold on this and choose "**Forget Network**" so that a new connection is created from scratch
- 4 Next, tap on "**eduroam**" normally and a configuration screen will appear
- 5 Under "**EAP**" method choose **PEAP**
- 6 Under "**Phase 2 authentication**" choose "**MSCHAPV2**". If MSCHAPV2 isn't listed, you can leave this set to "None"
- 7 Leave the two Certificate Settings set to "unspecified"
- 8 In "Identity" enter your usual university username followed by @brighton.ac.uk e.g. abc12@brighton.ac.uk
- 9 Leave "**Anonymous Identity**" blank

Enter your usual university password in the password box, then tap "**Connect**" and your device should connect to eduroam.
