

# Student Services: Eligibility for Students

## Current Students

All current students of the University of Brighton are eligible to use Student Services.

## Alumni

- Alumni of the University of Brighton can use the Careers Service for life - see the [Careers](#) website for more information.
- [Nursery](#) places are available to children of University of Brighton students and staff, and also to children from the local area, including Alumni.

## Partner Colleges

Students studying at partner colleges on indirectly funded courses validated by the University of Brighton, can access the full range of services and support from the University. This includes student services, sports and learning facilities on all campuses; membership of student societies and sports teams; student advice services and financial support including income-related bursaries and university scholarships.

We recommend that students contact the support services at their local college of study in the first instance, as this can often be quicker than accessing university services

For students on directly funded courses, all services and support will be provided by your college. If you are not sure of the funding status of your course, please contact your course leader.

## Troops for Teachers

Students studying on the Troops to Teachers Programme, can access the full range of services and support from the University providing the University of Brighton is listed as the 'home' institution.

This includes student services, sports and learning facilities on all campuses; membership of student societies and sports teams; student advice services, disability and dyslexia and financial support including income-related bursaries and university scholarships.

Students who do not have the University of Brighton listed as their 'home' institution have full access to learning resources at the University but not to support. These students should access their home university for student support.

In the case of Disability and Dyslexia support – any non 'home' student who has academic adjustments recommended by their 'home' institution can expect the University to put the recommended adjustments in place, but the University of Brighton

has no financial responsibility for associated costs relating to that student disability or disability support. The University of Brighton would invoice the home HEI to recover any costs. NB – each student has an awarding university (ie the university that validates their academic award) and a home university (usually but not always the university located closest to an enrolled student in terms of geography or ease of access).

Students are enrolled at both their awarding and home university. The home university for each student is defined during the admissions process.

### **University of Brighton International College (UBIC)**

Access to Student Services for students at UBIC varies by service. We recommend students contact the college in the first instance - the college has access to [Service Level Agreements](#) which details the support students are able to access from the University.
